Evangelist Johnnie Mae Henderson is the eldest of two beautiful daughters born to Inetta Crittenden in Tula, Mississippi. She spent much of her early academic years on the Southside of Chicago, Illinois and the remaining chapters of a storied life in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. She completed her GED from Oklahoma Industrialization Center, and constantly sought self-improvement through a series of trade school programs and collegian studies.

She was introduced to Jesus Christ in 1974, after a chance meeting with her soon to be husband Andrew Henderson, Jr. This meeting would prove to be more than a union between a woman and a man, but a much more important union with a life-long family and her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Her marriage to Andrew Henderson Jr., would last more than 33 years, yet the connection with the Henderson Family never ended as she was and always will be Sister, Friend, Aunt, and Mother to many.

Evangelist Henderson found joy in many activities throughout her life, but her love for photography made her immensely happy. She enjoyed taking pictures of everyone and being able to share those photos with the people she photographed. Evangelist Henderson also worked hard at Mt. Zion replenishing chairs, floors, creating floral arrangements, and planning events. However, nothing brought her more joy than being a mother to her three children ReGina, Donald, and Clifton Johnson. She took pride in being their biggest cheerleader and inspired them to believe there was nothing they couldn't achieve with God in their lives.





The outstanding relationship she established with her children extended to her 12 Grandchildren, 8 Great Grandchildren, and numerous of nieces, nephews, and church children needing that extra loving attention.

In 1974, she began her dedication and commitment to her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and her commitment never wavered in the face of many adversities. Evangelist Henderson began her service to the Lord under the direction of Pastor Art Ladd Sr. of Apostolic Faith. Faithful to her family, as Pastor Fannie M. Henderson (mother-in-law) began Mt. Zion Apostolic Temple in 1978, she served under her leadership and that devotion extended to her current Pastor District Elder Kevin Henderson.
