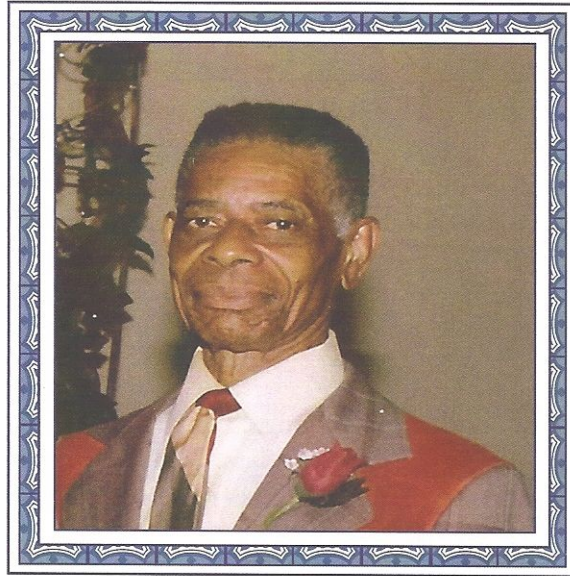

Remembering William Henry McNeely

The angel that was known as William McNeely was born May 22nd, 1930 to Luster and Bessie McNeely in Blair, Texas. He was the fourth eldest of five children. William received Christ at an early age. He was a faithful and active member of Antioch Baptist Church in Oklahoma City for over fifty years. He grew up in Oklahoma City where he met his soul mate and the love of his life, Nancy Montgomery. They were married on August 21st 1960 and spent the next 53 years together raising a family in Oklahoma City.
