

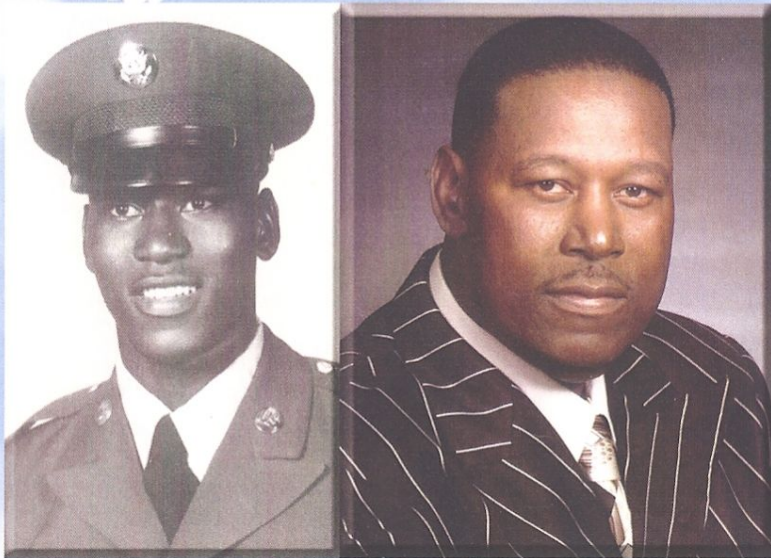

Otto Jefferson "Jeff" Loggins, Jr., was born January 28, 1948 to Otto Jefferson Loggins, Sr. and Marteaal Tamplin Loggins in Clearview, Oklahoma. He was the seventh of ten children.

Jeff attended Clearview School through the fifth grade, at which time his family moved to Okmulgee, OK. He attended Okmulgee schools until his graduation in 1966.

Jeff accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior and joined the Mt. Zion Baptist Church in Okmulgee where he was an active member. Throughout the years he continued to provide support to his first church home.

Jeff served in the U.S. Army from 1966 to 1969, attaining the rank of Sergeant (Squad Leader), and receiving an honorable discharge.

After serving his country, Jeff returned to Oklahoma City, enrolled in Rose State College, Midwest City, OK, where he obtained an Associates Degree. During his working career, Jeff was employed by Wilson's Foods, and later by Tinker AFB, where he remained until his retirement in 1999.

Jeff and his devoted wife, Patricia, joined New Hope Baptist Church in 2006 and he remained there until his death. While at New Hope, he served as treasurer for the Brotherhood, vice-president of the Usher Board, and instructed the usher trainees. He was instrumental in providing labor and direction for the remodeling of church properties.

Jeff was an avid motorcyclist and was a member of the Zodiac Motorcycle Club. He was the proud owner of a Harley.

Jeff will be sorely missed by all that knew and loved him. He was a true friend that enjoyed helping anyone in need of help, that crossed his path. Above all, Jeff was a Christian who loved his Father in Heaven and His Son Jesus Christ.

Jeff was called home on Friday, March 21, 2014, after a long battle with cancer. His wife Patricia and his daughter Hasani were at his side.
