Celebration of Life of Charlotte M. Chatman

Charlotte Marian Mackey was born in Bristow, Oklahoma to the union of the late Charles E. H. Mackey and Annie Powell Mackey. She was their only child. Before she was born, her mother prayed that Charlotte would serve the Lord in the area of music. Both of her parents tried to insure that wish was fulfilled. When she was in elementary school, they drove her to the Latimer's School of Music in Tulsa from Bristow weekly for musical instruction. They did that for several years. During the summer months, she and her mother rode the Greyhound Bus to Tulsa so that she could study Clarinet. Because of this she became proficient in playing the Alto Saxophone and Piano. She also studied music at Oklahoma State University.

Charlotte accepted Christ at an early age at the Duffey Chapel Baptist Church in Bristow, Oklahoma, under the pastorage of the late Reverend Percy Mayes.

After graduating from college in 1964, she relocated to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma where she united with the Mt. Olive Baptist Church under the pastorage of the late Reverend E. R. Neal.

Charlotte was united in marriage to LaVirgust Chatman on July 12, 1964. They were very happy. To this union two sons were born: LaVirgust Charles Chatman and Colin Deane Chatman. She wanted each of her students to develop beyond their potential.

Her community organizations and professional memberships included: YWCA, Great Plains Association of Counselors, Licensed Professional Counselors, American Federation of Teachers, Order of the Eastern Star, OASCD, Oklahoma Retired Educators Association, Eta Phi Beta and Beta Sigma Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., where she served as Scholarship Chairperson for several years. She was the recipient of several honors and awards both at her church and in the educational realm. Some of the awards received at Greater Mt. Olive include: Leroy Breshear's Servant Award, Reverend A.G. Woodberry Special Award (Pastor's Award), Award for over 30 years of dedicated service, Senior Choir Award - 1993 and 1996, and Male Chorus Award - 1993. In 2014, she was honored with a Celebration for 50 Years of continious service to the Greater Mt. Olive Baptist Church. She was honored by the Oklahoma City Chapter of GMWA as one of the Living Legends of Gospel Music in 2016.
