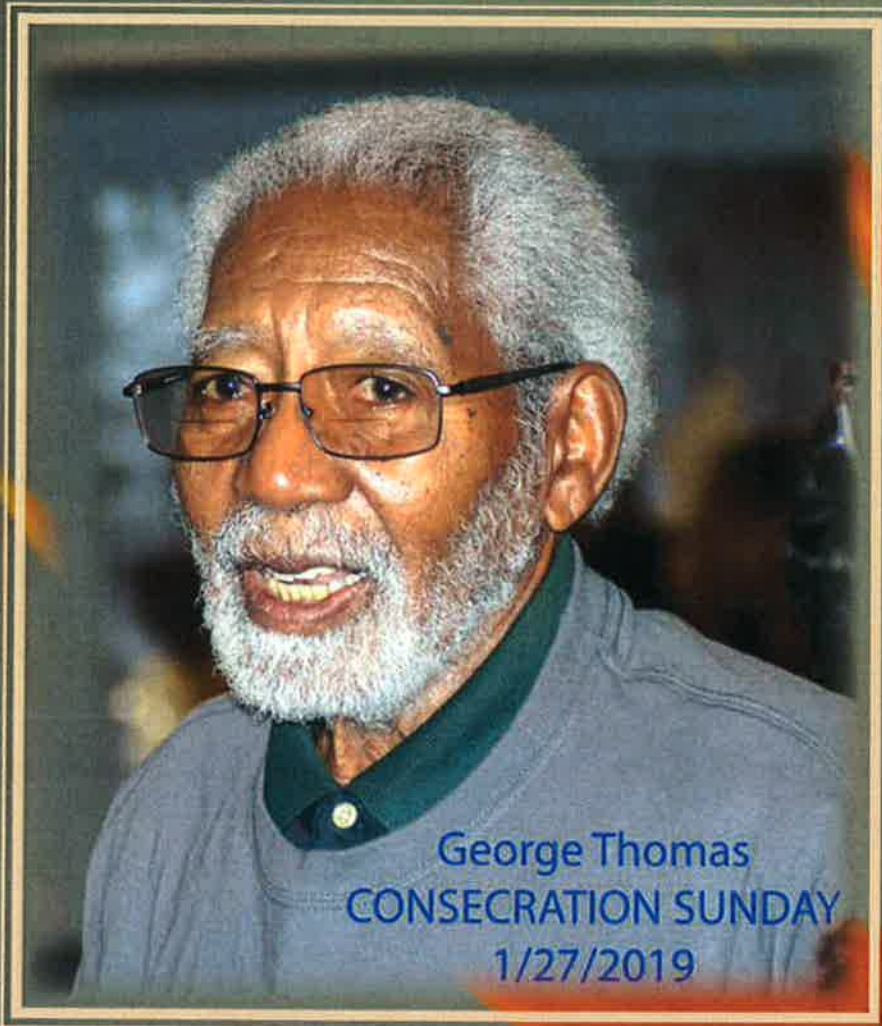


Equipment

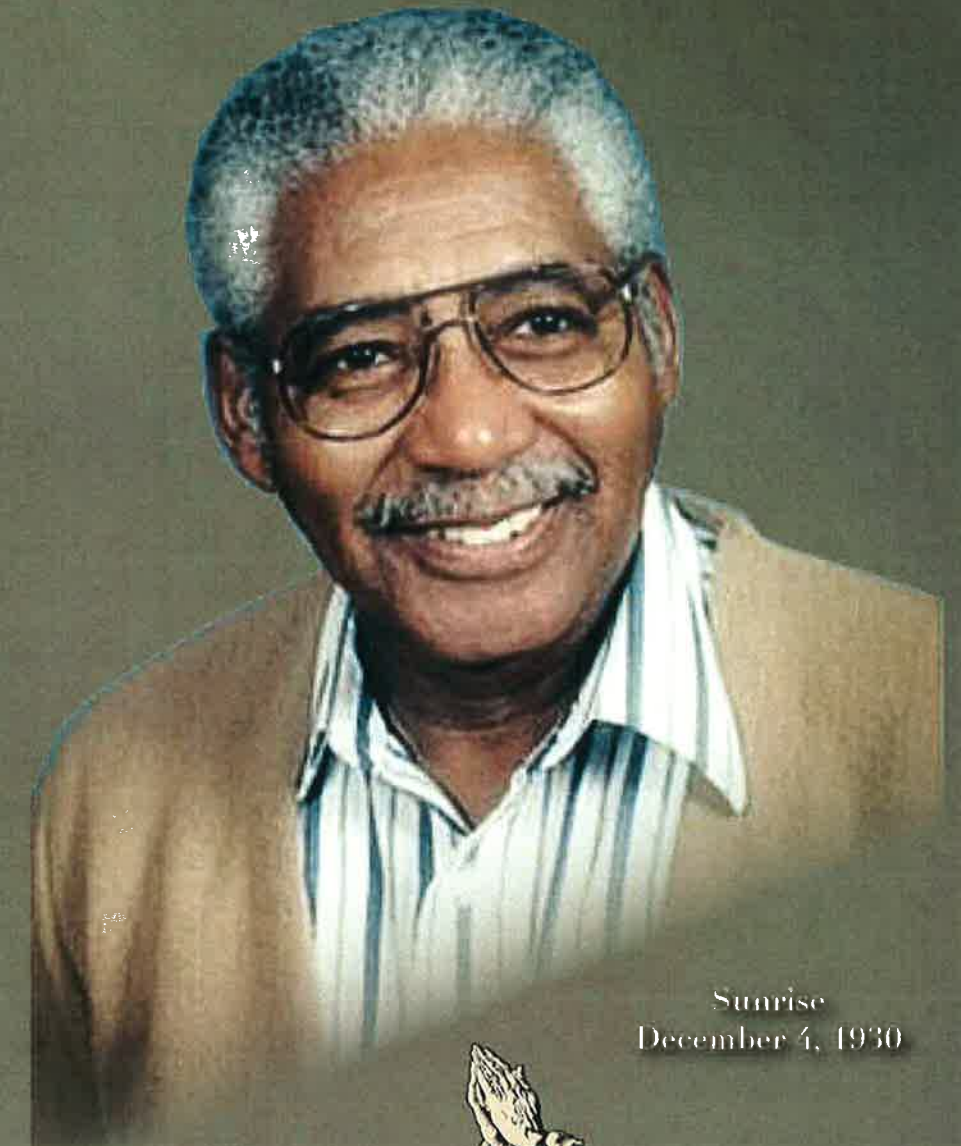

Obituary

George Leon Thomas was born in Mobile, Alabama on December 4, 1930. He was reared by Elizabeth Marshall, a single mom. He grew up in the church and was baptized at an early age.

George attended and graduated from the Mobile Public School System. He later attended Junior college in Chicago, Illinois.

After high school graduation George moved to Chicago where he met his future wife, Dorothy London. They were married on January 19, 1952. Two children were born to this union.

Beginning in 1952 in Chicago and ending in Dallas in 1982, George worked for Braniff Airways in Ground Services. After moving to Oklahoma City he joined the Lyons and was active for several years. He worked for Mary Mahoney for many years.
