## Obituary

Dr. Sheron Ruth Dewberry House was the eldest child of Kathryn C. Dewberry and Frank Dewberry, Jr. was born December 7, 1963 in Chandler, Oklahoma. Her family made their home in Guthrie, Oklahoma. She learned to read at the age of three and from the cart, she would read the names of the cereals as she and her mother traveled down the grocery store aisles. Nothing made her happier than a good book. She professed a hope in Christ at an early age and was baptized by her father at Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church, Arcadia, Oklahoma.

Sheron received her musical training from Mrs. Flora J. Mack; skills she used playing for the choir at St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church, of Meridian Oklahoma, where her father pastored.

Sheron was a true worshiper and her voice was that of an angel. She was an All-State Vocalist and won numerous awards, competitions, and accolades for her music and academic accomplishments. During her time at Guthrie High School she was a member of Chorus, Drama Club, Marching Band, was an All-State Clarinetist and leader of the Flag Core. Sheron thrived for perfection in every avenue of her life. Her academic stellar gained her membership to the National Honor Society and upon her graduation from Guthrie High School, she was accepted to the renowned University of Oklahoma.

While at the University of Oklahoma, she studied music under the vocal instruction of Dr. Marilyn Govich and the late Dr. Bruce Govich. Early in her singing career, Sheron won a vocal competition which assisted with paying for her education. Sheron was an Oklahoma Sooner through and through, accomplishing many accolades to her name. Sheron was on the President's Honor Role (1985), the Deans Honor Role (1983-1985), and achieved the Highest Grade Point Average—College of Fine Arts (1983-1985). She was a member of the prestigious Phi Kappa Lambda National Music Honor Society (1985), received the Mary Clarke-Miley Minority Scholarship Award (1984), and was named the Carol Brice Outstanding Music Student (1983). Sheron receive a Bachelors (Summa Cum Laude) in Music Instruction and Education(1985). She later received her Master's in Musical Education (Summa Cum Laude, 1988). Sheron went on to receive her Doctorate Degree (Summa Cum Laude) in Education Administration and School law on May 10, 2003.

Sheron began her career in education as a music teacher for Madison Elementary in Norman, Oklahoma. She went on to become the Chief Choral Director and Music Teacher for Brink Jr. High, of the Moore Public School District. During her time with Moore Public Schools, Sheron went on to become the assistant principal for Red Oak Elementary School, and later was named assistant principal of Winding Creek Elementary School. In 1996, Sheron was appointed the assistant principal for John Ross and Haskell Elementary in the Edmond Public School District. On May 3, 1999, Sheron was promoted to the head principal of Will Rogers Elementary where she served for two decades (20 years). During her time at Will Rogers she thrived in her element. Her dynamic personality, tenacity for achievement, and abundance of grace proved beneficial to her longevity.
