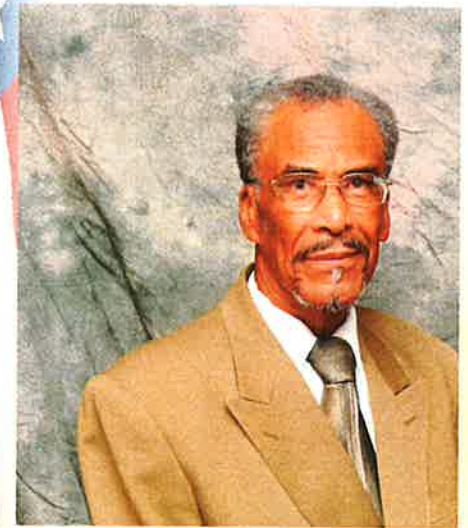

Sunrise - September 2, 1936

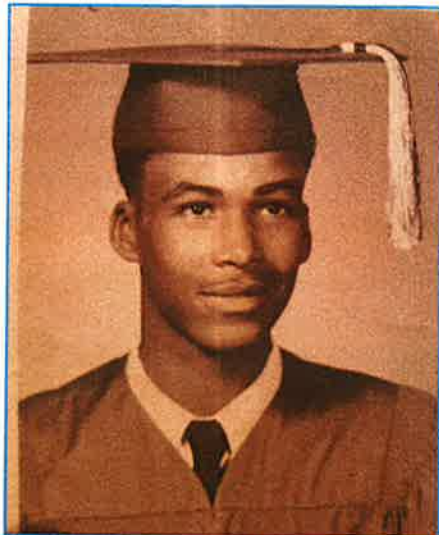

On Friday, January 10th, 2020, God sent his angel to quietly and gently take our Loved-on Rev. Dr. Marvin J. Tyler home. Marvin was born in Ivan, Arkansas, September 2, 1936 to the late Rev. Marion T. Tyler and Mrs. Nora C. Matlock –

He married Betty June Tyler on February 1, 1964. To this union 3 daughters were born, Rita Y. Tyler Stallworth (Eddie) Sonja Y. Tyler – Carrasquillo, Teresa Y. Tyler.

Growing up in Fordyce, Arkansas, Marvin attended Dallas County Training School, Fordyce, AR. After graduating from High School, he enlisted in the US Air Force. His plan was to serve in the Military for four years and then pursue college. As a Communications specialist, he served many tours of duty including Paris, France, Tripoli, Libya. In 1978, Marvin retired from the United States Air Force with Honors.

He was a member of the (B) Squadron NCO of the Quarter United States Air Force.

In 1991, Marvin enrolled in Oklahoma Baptist University and received his Associate Degree in Christian Education. In 1997, Marvin began work on his bachelor's degree and a minor in Business Management and graduated on December 14th, 2007. In addition, Marvin received an Honorary Doctorate Degree from the Fellowship Bible Institute of Tulsa Oklahoma on August 12, 2012. Dr. Tyler worked for the State of Oklahoma as a Statistical Analyst Researcher from 1979 – 1995.

He also worked for: Broadway Ford – Service Representative, TLC Daycare – Day Care Bus Driver and Millwood Elementary – Substitute Teacher

At the age of 14, Marvin knew there was a calling on his life to preach the Gospel. He was ordained on January 20th, 1985 by Pastor W. K. Jackson, St. John Missionary Baptist Church. From 1987 to 1999, he served as the Minister of visitation to the sick and shut in.

God afforded him to be a blessing to many in other churches, namely: Siloam Baptist Church, First Baptist Church of Douglass, Mt. Lebanon Baptist Church, Zion Hill Missionary Baptist Church that he organized and founded in 2003.

At the time of his passing, he attended the Church of God Through Christ.

Dads life was dedicated to his family and Serving the Lord. He could often be found tinkering with cars, singing with the Sons of Thunder quartet, or hanging out with the grandkids. He loved his family and enjoyed attending all family activities whether near or far and was a wealth of wisdom.
