



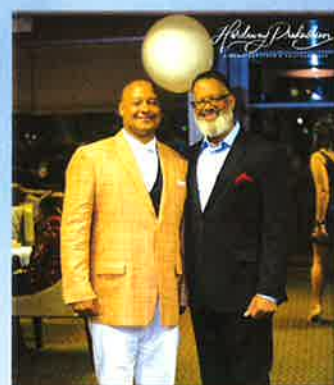
# *A Father Just Like You*

Obituary

Quincy D. House was the last of three children born to Esther and Allen House Sr. in Oklahoma City, OK. His beloved parents and nephew Robert D. McRoy II preceded him in death.

While growing up in the Creston Hills community, Quincy began cultivating his gift of forming lifelong friendships. As a lover of education, he completed his primary schooling at Corpus Christi Catholic School and graduated from Mt. Saint Mary’s High School in 1987. He attended Rose State College where he was a member of the Raiders basketball team. Continuing his education at The University of Oklahoma, Quincy served as the Black Student Association President. He graduated in 1992 with a B.A. in Political Science, Pre-Law.

Quincy was a man of strong Christian faith. At an early age, he served as a member of Corpus Christi Catholic Church. He later became a member of Northeast Missionary Baptist Church.

In the summer of 1990, Quincy met the love of his life Chermane “Totty” Bert whom he later married on New Year’s Day, January 1, 1994. To this union two sons were born, Quinten and Collin.

Quincy has always had an entrepreneurial spirit owning and operating several businesses alongside his mother; most notably Quincy’s Grill. He was employed at the Oklahoma Juvenile Bureau for five years as a Detention Officer. Quincy then returned to his alma mater, University of Oklahoma, as Assistant Director of the Center for Student Life. He furthered his career in the oil and gas industry working for Chesapeake Energy, Seventy-Seven Energy, and lastly with NexTier as an Environmental Health & Safety Coordinator.
