OBITUARY OF ELECT LADY BRYANT...THE LADY OF GRACE

The words of Solomon found in Proverbs thirty-one bears witness to the exemplary life of Elect Lady Alice M. Bryant. The Elect Lady's commitment and loyalty to God, her husband, family and the Church required her to function in many roles. She was a wife, mother, sister, aunt, teacher, mentor, friend, nurse, chef, counselor, First Lady, committee chair, referee and most of all, a Woman of God.

The Elect Lady Bryant was the 3rd of five daughters born to the union of Timothy and Alzina Murray, on July 30, 1937 in New Roads, Louisiana. She attended High School of Commerce in Detroit, Michigan where she graduated with honors in Business Administration.

Elect Lady Bryant accepted Jesus into her life, as her personal Savior and Lord. She was baptized in water and received the gift of the Holy Ghost at Clinton Street Greater Bethlehem Temple, in Detroit, Michigan under the Pastoral care of Bishop S.N. Hancock. The spiritual new birth she experienced according to John 3:1-7, brought about a transformation that change the trajectory of her life. She immediately got busy working in the Youth Ministry while she continued to grow and mature in the things of God.

June 9, 1956 Elect Lady Bryant met and married the love of her life – the late Bishop Arnett Bryant, Sr. in Detroit, Michigan. To this union 7 children were born. They both continued to serve faithfully in the ministry until God called them to Oklahoma City, OK, to pastor New Bethlehem Temple. In June, 1962, the Elect Lady shifted her career interests and goals to coincide with the vision and pastoral assignment of her late husband. She worked untiringly, beside her husband doing whatever her hands found to do, in order to see the vision come to finition. One of the many things Elect Lady Bryant enjoyed doing in ministry and was passionate about was teaching Sunday School – she was definitely anointed to teach. In addition, she provided clothes for those who were in need; and spearheaded an annual Thanksgiving meal for the indigent. After her husband was called from labor to reward, the Elect Lady assumed the pastoral role of the church for three years.

The Elect Lady was a selfless woman, full of compassion and love. Every Mother's Day she looked forward to presenting floral bouquets to the senior mother's and a single rose to every woman who entered the service.

She was also known for her generous hospitality, by, if you had the opportunity to say at her home you were treated with royalty. She would feed you, draw your bath water and ensure you were comfortable for a good night's rest.

Throughout her life she maintained a sweet and simple demeanor and a contagious smile that won the trust and heart of many. She was the epitome of grace and class, and exemplified the love of Christ with her life. She also loved children, in fact, she was the God-mother of many of the children of Greater New Bethlehem Temple. The impact she made on her family and community is one that will continue to be felt and seen for generations to come. She understood that legacy was not just about what you have done, but what you leave behind.

Elect Lady Alice M. Bryant was preceded in death by her mother and father. Timothy and Alzina Murray, her husband, Bishop Arnett Bryant, Sr., daughter, Lisa Gray, and son Michael Warren Bryant.
