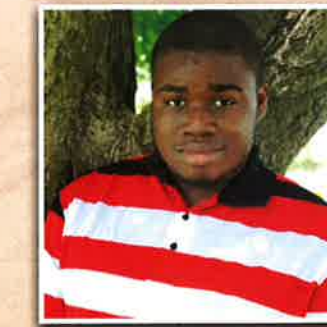
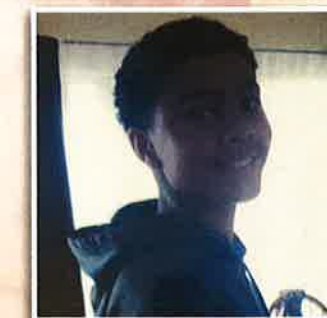
She always leaned to watch for us

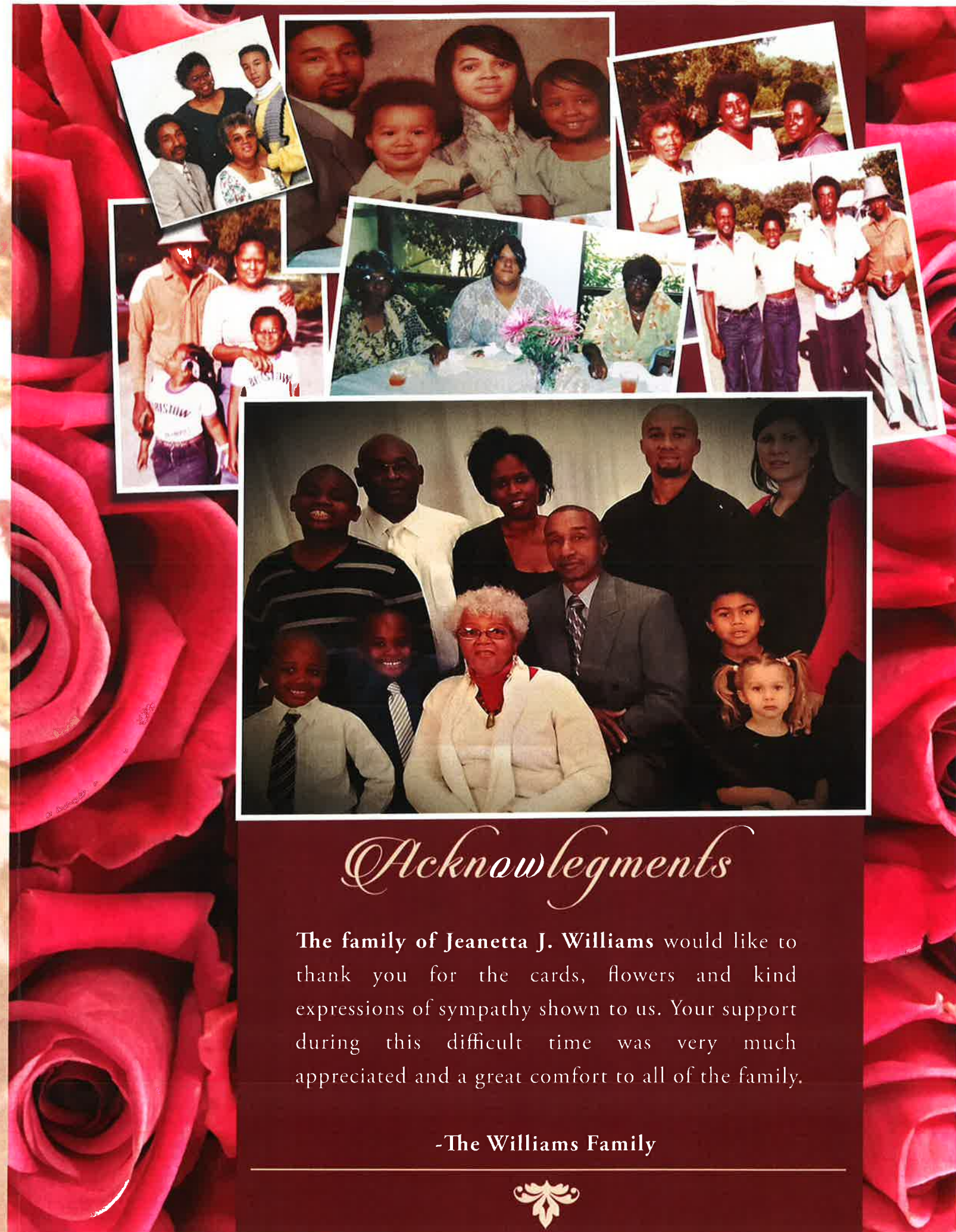
