

He graduated from Tarrant County College and was a student at Tarleton State University (expected graduation-May 2021). He worked for the My Health My Resources of Tarrant County as a Mental Health Specialist Technician and in his spare time volunteered with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Welcome Home/New Arrivals Ministry as a chaplain, in which the Texas Parole Board awarded as a top volunteer organization in the state, he prepared and delivered street bags filled with essential care items for the homeless population, and served as a sports referee with his brother Larry Lewis, for the Ft. Worth ISD and Arlington ISD.

Michael was such a special person and touched the lives of many people; he truly had a heart for ministry and service.

On April 12, 2020 Michael was admitted to the hospital with acute respiratory disease and began his battle against COVID-19. I'M FREE


Don't grieve for me, for now I'm free


