The Life of Daisy Sandidge

Daisy was born to Samuel Joseph Stutson and Sadie Mae Stutson on July 23, 1940 in Guthrie, Oklahoma. She was the oldest of 6 children, Samuel Joseph Jr, Esther Larute, Larry Eugene, Donald Ray, and Eddie Lee. Their family soon moved to the Garden Days Community in Oklahoma City where they grew up. Daisy graduated from Douglas High School in 1957 with a license in cosmetology.

After High School, Daisy moved to Pontiac, Michigan to work. She was a great dancer and often told stories of winning dance contests all over Pontiac and Detroit, Michigan. She loved to shop and maintained a fabulous wardrobe from her youth until her passing.

Daisy was the proud mother of 3 children, Michael, Kimberly, and Sharla. In April of 1976, Daisy married William Charles Sandidge and moved to Kansas City. She not only gained a husband but 9 additional beautiful children, Calvin, Michael, William Jr, Linda, Kevin, Amy, Jerome, Robert, and Troy. Somehow without even trying Daisy and Charles created their own Black Brady Bunch including the wood panel station wagon. Together they created a bond with the 2 families that will never be broken.

Daisy loved her blues and family. If you rode in the car with her and you weren't a blues fan you soon would be because you were definitely going to hear some blues.

Daisy was also known for her encouraging ways. She never kept it a secret if she was proud of you, thought you had done a good job, or was happy that you had some talent. Not only did she tell you, she told everyone else she spoke with. She made it a point to spend time and make and maintain connections with the people in her life. She spoke with her children daily but also made special connections with her grandchildren, great grandchildren, brothers, sister, nieces, nephews, and friends.

Daisy worked in the Medical field for over 40 years before retiring. She spent much of her career managing the health care team for a wealthy businessman and his wife.

She retired to her hometown of Oklahoma City in 1991 and opened Boogie Down Records, a record store on 23rd street in the heart of the eastside of the city. She was able to enjoy the music she loved and make a dream come true of being an entrepreneur. She sponsored concerts and hosted many celebrities including Bernie Mac, Luther and Betty Wright. Later she was known for selling flowers every Memorial Day on 23rd street and creating gift baskets. But making and selling Easter baskets brought her more joy than any of her endeavors.

In 2017, Daisy moved to Grandview, MO, a suburb of Kansas City, with her daughter, Sharla, where she remained until the end of her life.

Daisy was preceded in death by her parents, Samuel and Sadie Stutson, brother Samuel Stutson Jr, and Bonus children Calvin James Sandidge and William Sandidge, Jr.
