

On September 25, 1952, a precious bundle of joy was delivered to Marshall and Mattie Richardson in The Unity Community of Holdenville, OK. They lovingly named him WAYNE DORNELL. He was the 9th of 11 children born to the union.

Wayne attended elementary and high school at Moss School, Holdenville, OK. He graduated high school in 1970 and afterwards attended Okmulgee Tech. He joined the Marine Corps in 1971, where he served four years and received the National Defense Service Medal. He continued his education at Central State University. He began his career at Tinker Air Force Base, where he spent 34 years. He retired as an Aircraft Inspector in 2014. After retirement, he placed his focus on his real estate consulting business.

Wayne was baptized at an early age by Rev. Freddie Griffis at Unity Baptist Church, in the rural Unity Community. As a child, he attended sunday school, church, prayer meetings, and other church functions. The teachings of his early years were ingrained in him, and he attended these services until God called him home.



He loved sports (basketball, football, and baseball). He played softball for a local team, The All Stars, in his younger days. He still loved to participate in softball games during family outings. He also loved to talk politics, play dominoes, and spend time with family. He loved his son, daughter, and grandson unconditionally. He liked good food; his favorites were chicken 'n dressings, greens, banana pudding, and butter-rolls. But most importantly, he loved being a servant of God, his church, and church family.

On September 28, 2020, Wayne Dornell Richardson was Called to Rest by Our Heavenly Father. His parents, brother, Barry "Skeet," and beloved niece, Kellie Allen, preceded him in death.
