Margaret accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at St. James Baptist Church, Spencer, OK., under the pastoral leadership of Rev. J. Vance Jenkins.

In 1956 she married the love of her life, Edward Ford whom she affectionately called "POPS." To this union five children were born.

In October, 1961, Margaret rededicated her life to Jesus and united with True Vine independent Baptist Church, under the pastoral leadership of Rev. H.A. Walker, where she was an active member of the Young Adult Choir and Senior Choir She also taught Sunday School at the True Vine Northeast Mission.

Margaret was very quiet in her younger years, but as she became older she became more talkative - much like her dad, Alfred.
