## Obituary

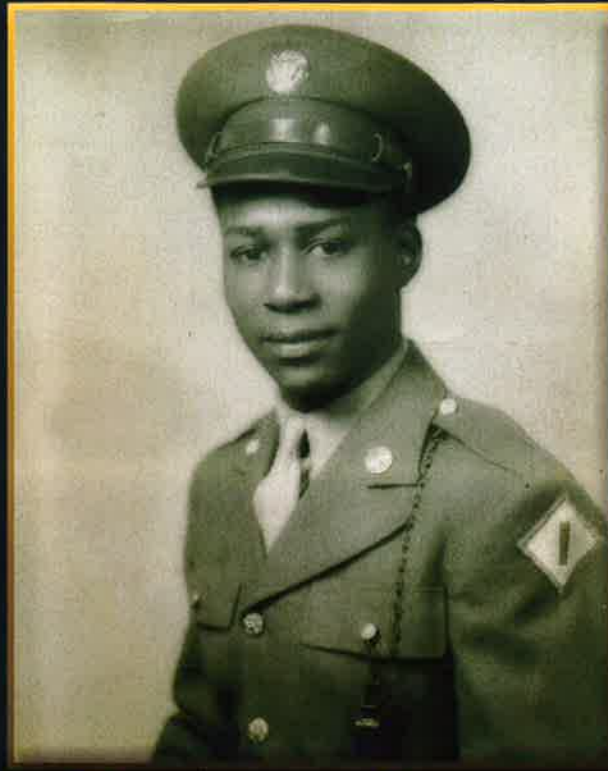
