Ernestine Farmer Mc Neely

Steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord... That's My Mama

Mama was born March 14, 1924 to Papa and Big Mama (William Arbury) and Narcissus Jenkins Heath) For some reason it was important to her that you knew she was born first and her twin sister Geraldine was born second. Mama was raised in Southtown. She went to Orchard Park School and Douglas High. Later she went to school at OU Medical and graduated with a dietitian certificate.

Mama married S. Farmer in 1941. She later married G. McNeely in 1956. Mama was so pretty. She had beautiful long black hair and always wore dresses. Mama was the best cook. Beans would simmer all day. Fried chicken was slow cooked for at least 2 hours. She baked sweet potato pies and pound cakes, She made collard greens and cooked Barbecue ribs in the

Mama's proudest moment in her life was when she got saved and filled with the Holy Ghost 68 years ago. Mama was Sunday School Teacher of the Year in 2008-2009, and 2013. She was presented The Kingdom Award for faith and support of the Kingdom by the Oklahoma Southeast Jurisdiction of the Church of God in Christ. She also received a special Grandma Award and Oldest Grandparent Award.

One Sunday I told Mama I couldn't go tho church because I was sick. Mama said, "When I come home you better still be sick", and I was. My ankle got cut really bad. Mama poured her oil into the wound, wrapped it with a white rag, and prayed. It healed! Mama prayed for her children. When one of us got sick she would get her bottle of blessed oil, anoint us, and pray. Whatever was wrong, when Mama prayed it had to go. When Dwight was deployed to Vietnam, Mama tore a page out of her bible and sent it to him. It was the 91 Psalm. She prayed and fasted until her son came home.

Mama outlived her Husband, 2 Children, 8 Sisters, 2 Brothers, 6 Nephews, and 3 Nieces.

Through Mama's Legacy came 4 generations, 5 children, 10 grandchildren, 24 great grandchildren, and 7 great grandchildren.
