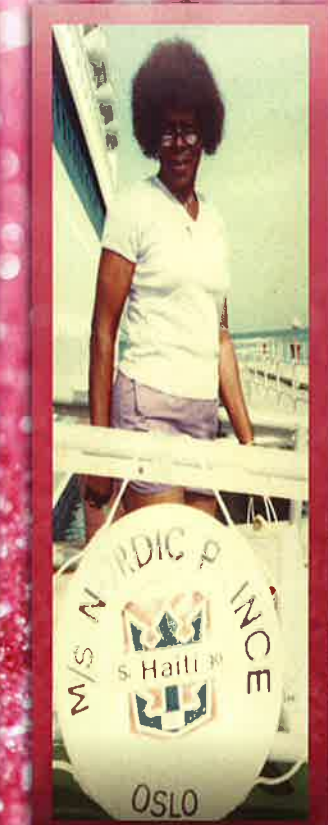
Costella's Prayer

Costella Weathersby's faith was made sight on December 16, 2020, at the age of 92. She passed into eternity in her home in Oklahoma City. She was surrounded by family in the hours prior to her heavenly arrival. Costella Weathersby (Green) was born March 30, 1928, to Elias and Dora Green of Garrison Tx. She accepted Christ at the early age of six at Mt. Mariah Baptist Church; where she was baptized in a nearby pond. Costella attended a one-room school through the 8th grade in Rush County, shortly afterward her family moved to Appley, Tx. She rode the state bus ten miles to attend school and in 1947, graduated from E.J. Campbell High School in Nacogdoches, Texas. After graduating she spent a year at Prairie View A & M. In 1948, the Green family built a home at 2500 Cotton Street, Nacogdoches, Tx. In 1950, she moved to Fort Worth to live with her older sister while attending John Peter Smith LVN School; there she received her LVN license. She worked at John Peter Smith hospital until 1960. She then moved to Dallas where she worked at V.A. Hospital until January 1965; she then transferred to V.A. Hospital in Oklahoma City, where she worked until she retired in 1995 with 30 years of service. After she retired, she took the NCLEX-PN and became a licensed LPN in Oklahoma City. She then worked part-time at a private hospital and worked as a caregiver in a

few homes. In April 1987, she married Albert Weathersby (Pops) who proceeded her in death and was a loving husband, grandfather and great grandfather.

She joined Emmanuel Baptist Church in 1966, where she was a faithful servant. Our mother served on the Usher board, General Missionary Society and Meals on Wheels. Our mother was a forceful and determined woman who wasn't afraid to say what was on her mind. She enjoyed cruising around the world, being active in the church, and helping with her great-grandchildren. She will be missed, and may God bless all those who knew and loved her.

Our mother was preceded in this journey by her parents, Elias and Dora Green; sisters: Constance, Flosceal, Johnny, Willie and Carmena; brothers: Billy, Jesse, Cecil and Charles.
