Obituary

Opal Childs lived to be 104 years old and as she would proclaim, it was not because she was good, "it was because of God." Opal was born June 18, 1916 in Guthrie, Oklahoma; the daughter of Lula and Grandison Jones. They were "poverty stricken poor". She lived during a time where toilets were outside, cooking was done on wood stoves, no refrigeration, and limited formal education was available.

As a youth, Opal attended Lincoln School in Guthrie, OK and just like many poor families during this time she picked cotton to help her family survive. She was observant and learned how to cook by reading cookbooks to take care of herself, her family, and others. She worked her way into some of the most prominent homes as a cook in both Oklahoma and California.

In Oklahoma City she worked for the owner of the C.R Anthony stores and owners of Owens Sausage Co. Sometimes Opal would work two jobs at a time - in homes during the day and in restaurants at night as the head cook.

If you were to ask Opal, "what is the secret for a long life?" she would tell you, "MIND your own business, get plenty of rest, and read your Bible". Opal's family was part of the founding members of the Church of the Living God in Oklahoma and she was a devoted member all of her life. Opal was always a lady who was full of wisdom and possessed an extraordinary memory. Opal spent a lot of her spare time reading, making lye soap and hair oils, cooking and attending to her house plants.

In 1941, Opal married Melvin B. Childs Sr. She gave birth to two children, Wilma Childs-Sykes and Melvin B. Childs Jr. When Opal was asked how she felt about losing both of her children, she would look you straight in your eyes and say, "God took two, and gave me many."

Her grandchildren became the pride of her life; she enjoyed spending as much time with them as she could. Not even their parents could chastise them when Opal was around. In her eyes they could do no wrong. She would wear all of her friends, family members, and their parents out talking about her grandchildren. She gave each one of them their nicknames; Rosalinde (Rocky), Melvin III (Skeet), Lafayette (Charlie Brown), and Kristie (Pooky).

Her grandchildren equally loved going to her house. They would wake up to the smell of French popovers, eat wild greens picked from her garden, hang clothes on the line, and cook mud pies in her kitchen oven - something they could not do at home.

Opal was always an enjoyable person to be around. One thing you can say about her is when you were around her, there would be plenty of food to eat, plenty of laughter, and plenty of positive and amusing conversation.

She is preceded in death by her parents and her siblings Thelma, Roy, Harold, Hattie, Queen Esther, Charles, Newford, her husband Melvin B. Childs Sr. and her both of her beloved children, Wilma Childs-Sykes and Melvin B. Childs Jr.

She leaves to cherish her memory: her devoted daughter-inlaw, Beverly Childs, four grandchildren Rosalinde Childs-Henderson, Charlie Sykes, Melvin Childs III, and Kristie Childs-Knox, nine great-grandchildren, and 3 great-great grandchildren; several nieces, nephews, cousins, caregivers, and special friends who will remember her as a person who believed in God and the simple things of life.
