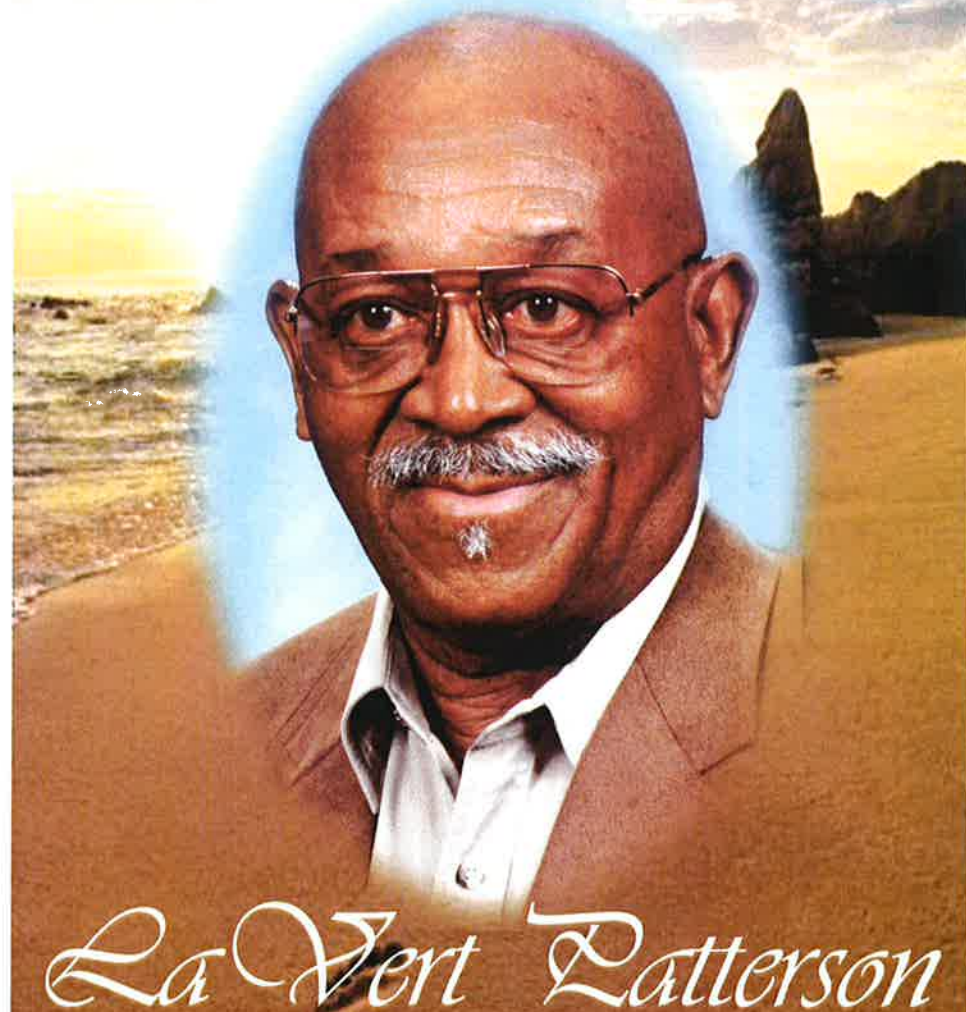

LaVert Robert Patterson, son of LaVert Patterson, Sr. and Lillie B. Gay, was born on February 13, 1929 in Idabel, Oklahoma.

EDUCATION & TRAINING

He attended Booker T. Washington High School in Idabel, Oklahoma, Denver University and Washington School Cosmetology.

LaVert received an honorable discharge from the United States Army and was awarded a certification of appreciation after suggesting an improvement to the design of a weapon.

After working at the Denver Mint for some time, he returned to Oklahoma City. He worked as a Health Investigator for the State of Oklahoma Department of Charities and Corrections, and was very proud to have helped implement the State wide Cycle Cell Anemia testing program.
