She was dedicated and always willing to do whatever was needed to help her church community.

Anna had a real zest for life. She loved to fish with her dad and sons. But her favorite had to be her "girl's night" where they would play cards and dominoes while sitting around laughing and fellowshipping. She had a knack for keeping "score" as a reminder of how bad she beat you. And let's not forget how she was about her soap operas. It was understood not to disturb her between 11am and 1pm.

Anna gave her life to raising her boys and helping them become God-fearing men. She was adamant about teaching them to cook, clean and sew while ensuring they had a personal relationship with God. Her nieces, nephews, grandchildren and great grand-children meant the world to her. Sharing life lessons, recipes and quality time with family was everything to her.

Anna was a matriarch and a fighter until her health began to fail in recent months. She remained determined, happy, energized, and focused on her family. Something as simple as sitting on her porch drinking a cup of coffee gave her such joy. She earned her wings June 7, 2021. She was preceded in death by her parents (Maxine and Robert L. Rusher), her 2 brothers (Walter Roberson and Robert E. Rusher) and two nephews (Rodney L. Rambo and Lawson D. McGaskey).
