Reflections of His Life

Richard E. Wright was born on July 31, 1944 in Wynnewood Oklahoma to Roscoe and Daisy Wright. Richard united with the Mt. Zion Baptist Church, Wynnewood, Oklahoma at a very early age. After moving to Oklahoma City he united with Bread of Life Baptist Church under the leadership of Rev. Gerald Wallace. He graduated from Lincoln High School in Wynnewood, Oklahoma.

After graduation, Richard joined the United States Army on October 25, 1963. He served in the Vietnam War in the 1st Battalion, 37th Field Artillery for six years. He returned home after an Honorable Discharge on April 17, 1969. Richard then joined the Oklahoma City Police Department where he served as a Field Trainer and a Master Patrolman. After 27 years on the force, Richard retired as a Sargent. After those years, he joined the U.S. Marshall Con Air Opp Homeland Security Services where he traveled the state and internationally. He worked in many Oklahoma City metro businesses and schools providing security services. Richard received many awards and certificates for a job well done in his line of duty.

On September 11, 1981 he married the love of his life, Donnie Hunt. To this union, two sons, Brandon and Roderick, were born whom he loved dearly. Richard always proclaimed Christ throughout his entire life. His final words to his wife were "God has been good to me." On January 15, 2022, at 1:00 a.m., God welcomed his servant home from suffering.

Both parents: Roscoe and Daisy; six brothers: Johnny, Billy, Roscoe Jr., Ruffus, Homer Lee, and Bethel; two sisters: Carolyn Phillips and Alta Mae Wright; Grandfather: Hughey Coats; and Grandmother: Emma Reese, all preceded him in death.


