After his passing in 2004, she joined Directions Outreach Ministries, with Barbara Robinson serving as pastor.

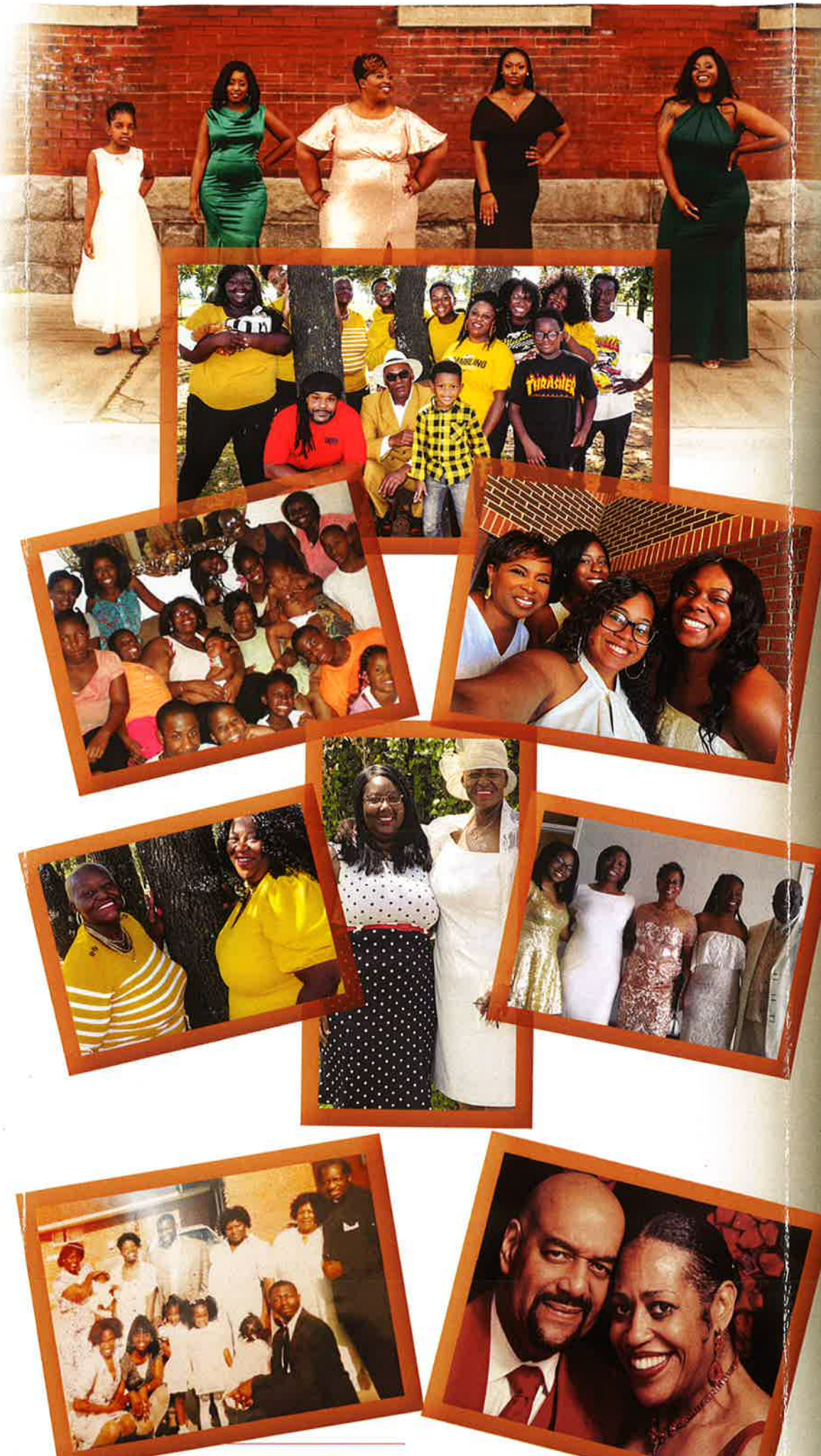

This love for others continued outside of the church. She was always available to listen, laugh or pray. Even though she couldn't cook, she would always make sure there was enough to eat and make sure that no one was left out or hungry.

Always there with an open heart, many never wanted to leave. She enjoyed spending the holidays with her family, sharing stories, love and laughter. Preceding her in death is her husband, Timothy, her parents James and Mary, and her siblings Thomas, Obie, Melvin, Mary Louise, Ida and Rosie.

Her five children, Timothy Jr (Ivie), Sherond Newton (Randell, decd.), Evelyn Cummings (William Sr.), Harold (Kim), and Alicia Evans (Michael), survive her.
