He and his ex-spouse DeLisa were blessed with 1 son Jordan Raheem Seals and 2 daughters (Jazmin DeRae Seals and Jade Elise Seals) and 2 grandchildren (Soraya Elise Seals and Solana Raelle Seals-Thompson).

Raymond graduated from Star Spencer High School where he played basketball and ran track. He was a photographer. He was an entrepreneur and started Jailed Art Kreation's Wearable Art. He was never at a loss for words; over time he developed them and became a poet creating beautiful poetry. He smiled when told you are still handsome and was still bossing everyone around and running things the day before he peacefully took his final breath on the eve of Easter Sunday.

LOVING WORDS FROM HIS father

While I was in business for 25 years, my sons would come to the shop. We would go down to Brown's bakery every morning to get donuts and drinks. Raymond didn't want to get his hands dirty, so he bought a pair of gloves and cut the fingers off to keep from getting his hands dirty. He would pump gas with gloves and collect the money. He would only do extra work if he could get ALL the money for fixing tires. I let him have a truck when he was in Dallas. He took the transmission out to repair it. I said I thought you didn't want to get your hands dirty; he said I was watching you all while you were working. Raymond was learning and when he had to start paying for things out of his own pocket, he started getting his hands dirty.
