OBITUARY

Edward Merrell Muex ended his watch suddenly on April 19, 2021 in Oklahoma City, OK.

Ed was 63 years of age. He was born in Cleveland, Ohio, raised in East Cleveland, Ohio where he graduated from Shaw High School. While in high school, Ed participated and excelled in music. He was a leader in the award-winning marching band and the world-renowned elite jazz band, playing Baritone Sax. He also participated in the theater stage crew and musical theater performances.

After High School, Ed joined the Marine Corps in 1977 where he served as an Avionics Technician and Avionics Instructor. He received further education in Avionics Maintenance Technology, Electronic Counter Measures, and Harris Digital Telephone Systems.

Ed met his wife Melody while serving in the Marine Corps. They were married April 16, 1982 and, together, had three daughters, Romel, Janee, and Charmaine. Edward was honorably discharged from the Marine Corps in Millington, TN in 1985.

After returning to civilian life Ed worked for Strom Technology as a Production Manager before joining the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Prisons where he worked 28 years as a Communication/Electronics Specialist and ending his career in a Supervisory capacity responsible for planning, direction and management, in addition to being responsible for maintaining the security of the institution. He received numerous awards and accolades while employed for the FBOP. Ed retired in 2015 and worked as a Range Safety Officer at Wilshire Gym while enjoying his family and his favorite hobby "flight simulation."

Ed is preceded in death by his father Edgar Mumford-Muex and his mother, Gwendolyn Camile Johnson-Sledge.

He is survived by his daughters Romel Muex, Janee Muex, Charmaine Osborne, wife Melody Muex, sister's Andrea M. Muex-Gray, Hope Lynne Peterson, grandchildren Kamden Edward Muex, Olive June Osborne, Ronald Osborne III, nephews Zacharie A. Collins, Mio Isaiah Correa and his niece Amria Peterson. Leaving behind also to mourn a host of friends and family worldwide.
