Steven Duane McCluney, was born in Kansas City Kansas on October 14, 1948. He was the only child born to the late Jordan Curtis (Pete) McCluney and the oldest child born to the late Gertrude Edith Hayes. After graduating from Washington High School in 1966, Steven relocated to Los Angeles, California and worked for McDonald Douglas where his father was employed. The United States Marines were looking for a few good men, so they drafted Steven in 1968. He achieved the rank of Lance Corporal.
