

Lucile worked for a time at Montgomery Ward's Department Store and later went on to have an extensive career as a Unit Clerk Supervisor with Baptist Hospital in Oklahoma City.

Lucile was involved in a multitude of civic, local, national organizations, some of which include: OKC Community Action Commodities program; OKC Urban League (Fashion Fair); Creston Hills Neighborhood Association; National Night out Barbecue; Neighborhood Holiday Party; Oklahoma Black Museum and Performing Arts Center; A+ Academic Association and the NAACP. She was also a dedicated volunteer working at polling stations for the Oklahoma County Election Board.

Lucile took pleasure in traveling over Thanksgiving weekends to New Orleans for the Bayou Classic, hosting parties and decorating for every holiday, which she did very well. It was a family tradition to attend fireworks displays, Christmas Light displays, attending annual festivals and celebrating Birthdays dining at her favorite restaurants. Lucile long enjoyed gardening and working in her flower bed attending to her roses. She loved to shop, try out new eateries and attend the yearly noonday services during the annual Simultaneous Revival. She worked with various churches at Camp Burge. Lucile was famous for her appetizing Cornbread dressing, rum cake, peach, cherry, pecan and sweet potato pies. Lucile will be profoundly missed by all of her family and many friends.

Lucile was preceded in death by her parents Alvin and Ever Thomas, her husband R.D., Ronnie (Pam) Williams, her daughter Eva Arneza Williams-Bly, Felica Kendrick and Charmaine Kendrick.
