Obituary

Annie Marie Caddy, an only child, was born to Leola Arena Caddy and Arthur B. White, September 19, 1938, in McKinney, Texas. Annie Marie's mother passed while giving birth, causing her to be raised by her grandfather along with a host of Aunts and Uncles. Annie Marie accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Union Baptist Church in Grayson, Oklahoma. She is preceded in death by both parents and one grandson.

Annie Marie attended Grayson School in Grayson, Oklahoma and at the age of thirteen moved to Oklahoma City to live with her Aunt Sedalia Miller after the death of her grandfather. Annie Marie continued her Christian walk with the Lord by uniting with New Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, where she worked with the Women's Missionary Society, Sunday School and Youth Department. She later joined Tabernacle Baptist Church, Oklahoma City, OK, where she continued to work on her Christian journey until her health would not permit her to attend.

While living in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma Annie Marie met and married her devoted husband Cary (Sonny) D. Noiel, Sr. on April 24, 1957. To this union six children were born.

Annie Marie was never one to be unemployed and held a variety of jobs in different career fields over her lifetime, including being the owner of Jean "N" Fresh Janitorial Service and a baker at Brown's Bakery. She was also employed by the Oklahoma County Sheriff's Department, where she became the first black, female lieutenant, and held this position until her retirement.
