Claude John (CJ) Hines Sr. was called home on July 8, 2021 to join his parents Willie and Jonnie May Hines and his 12 siblings who have all preceded him. At the age of 97, he was the last surviving of 13 children. Claude was born in Stroud, Oklahoma located in Lincoln County.

He was a proud member of the Laborers Union, Local 612 where he held the position of secretary and treasurer for 14 years. The position held significant influence as well as great prestige and honor in his community. He was well known for his relentless efforts to provide employment opportunities for young black men throughout the state of Oklahoma. Furthering his professional success, Claude owned several Conoco gas stations until his retirement. Claude was a lifetime member of the Laborers' International Union of North America.

However, retirement did not mean slowing down for Claude. He was constantly repairing mechanical items, completing roofing projects, landscaping his many properties, and building and creating carpentry projects. He was a lifelong craftsman, and he always had his beloved dogs by his side.

Claude's life was balanced and further fulfilled with his marriage of 65 years to Helen Anderson, whom he had four children with. Claude also had three sons before his marriage to Helen.

Claude John (CJ) Hines Sr. is survived by his wife, Helen, and his legacy will be continue through their children: Kenneth (Pamela), Darrell (Kathy), Jeanette (Carlton), and Charlotte (Tyrone); His 15 grandchildren and his 22 great-grandchildren.
