# Obituary

Rubye Jean Hill-Phillips was born on March 11, 1948 in Oklahoma City to the late Florence White Hill and Rev. Otis Hill, Sr.

Rubye was preceded in death by her sister Lawrence Darlene Hill and her brothers Woodrow, Warren, and Otis Hill Jr.

Rubye attended Edwards Elementary School, Moon Webster Jr. High School, and graduated from Douglass High School, Class of 1966. She went on to earn her bachelors degree in physical education from Northwestern Oklahoma State University, in Alva Oklahoma. Rubye was a member of the Zeta Phi Beta sorority and also a member of the Education Society Kappa Delta Pi. She received her masters degree from Central State University (UCO).

Rubye taught physical education at US Grant High School. She also worked at the Oklahoma County Juvenile Detention Center (The Barry House) from 1969 - 1972, and Drug Recovery Inc. for several years. Rubye was employed as a Federal Officer by the Federal Government Equal Employment Opportunity Commission for several years until her retirement.

Rubye was baptized early in life at the 3rd Street Church of God, and later in life she joined the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer, where she was currently a member.

Rubye was married to James Cheeley for a short period of time, then to her second husband John Phillips from 1970 - 1975.

Rubye leaves to mourn her cherished family; Monique Monea Hill, her sister; her nieces Stormy Gayle, Zsa Zsa Chappelle, Bogart DeShon, Gypsy Darlene and her nephew Otis Latral Hill; grand nephew Anthony (Prince) Carter Hill and her extended family; nephews Alexander and Charlton (The Twins), and London Rhodes, plus a host of other cousins, family and friends, to cherish her memory.

"Auntie" as she was affectionately called, leaves a legacy that is reflected in her genuine love, kindness, and generosity towards all who stepped through her door.
