





The Amazing Life of Zoletha Jones

On November 9, 2021, an Eastern Star ascended into heaven. This bright, brilliant and beautiful star, Zoletha Jones, was born on October 11, 1930 in Edna, Oklahoma to Edward and Alexzine Earnest. She was the only daughter of the two children born to this union. When she was a young girl, her mother passed away and she was raised by Alice Jackson (Aunt Coo). She spoke of very fond memories of growing up in Bristow, OK. She later moved to Oklahoma City and graduated from Douglas High School. For 22 years, she worked at Tinker Air Force Base until her retirement in 1987.

She served on the missionary circle and managed the kitchen. She later joined 5th Street Baptist Church where she was a member until she passed. She was also a member of several organizations including Order of the Eastern Star, Mary's Court #16, Delta Epsilon Sorority, Jephthah's Daughter #108, Daughters of Imperial Court and Heroines of Jerico, Alaraf Court #69.





The purity of her light and the depth of her love were unmatched. Her style, smile, love, and her strength has engulfed and sustained the Jones family. She's left an engrained mark on all of those who had the pleasure of being in her presence.
