Linda was preceded in death by her parents Guy and Vera Sadler.

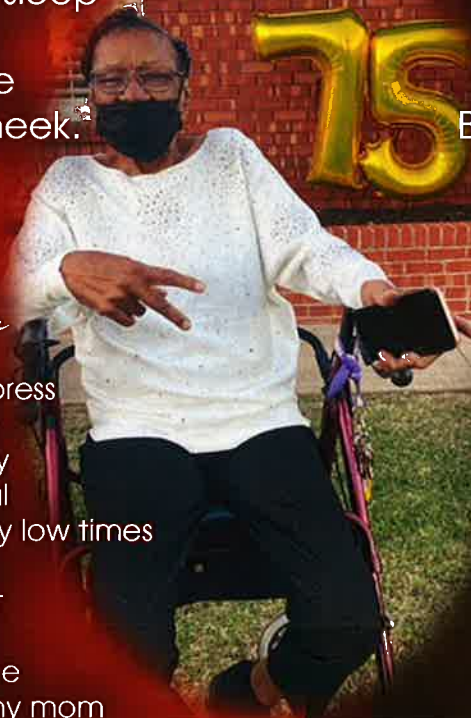
