Obituary

Roland and his first cousin, Rex, were like two peas in a pod and did everything together as they enjoyed the country life in Luther, Oklahoma. Rex would be mischievous and blame Roland, as a result, Roland would get a whipping and then he would put a whipping on Rex.

Roland attended school and graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in Luther, OK in 1951. He exceled in sport and was an outstanding Math student.

Roland was a hard worker from his childhood to adulthood which landed him numerous jobs. He retired from Dayton Tire in Oklahoma City as a supervisor in the Bandbury Department after 27 years.
