Norma Delores Scott was born on April 6, 1950 to Saul and Malinda Bunn, in Oklahoma City, OK. She was the youngest of three beautiful daughters. She was later adopted by her stepfather Warren Hudspeth. Norma accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Fairview Baptist Church.

Norma's early education was obtained in Oklahoma City, where she attended Dunbar Elementary and F.D. Moon Middle School. She was among the first class to integrate Northeast High School and graduated in 1968 with honors. At Northeast, in addition to excelling academically, Norma was very involved in extracurricular activities. She was the first African American Basketball Queen, a member of the National Honor Society, Girls State, and a Courtesy Club School Ambassador. She was also very involved in her community, participating in the NAACP and political activism. Upon graduation, she attended Oklahoma State University majoring in Business Administration. In 1969, she was chosen as a Debutante for the Nu Vista Club of Oklahoma City.

Norma was united in marriage to Willie Stevenson in 1970, and from this union produced one cherished daughter, Nicole.

Norma was a renaissance woman who was blessed to enjoy a variety of career pathways. Creative and resourceful, she was a producer for a public access television show and a local radio station. She also worked in finance for General Motors. She moved to Dallas, Texas in 1985, to work for the Federal Reserve Bank. Finally, ending her career at the North Tejas Girl Scouts Council in Plano, Texas, where she worked for 18 years and retired in 2018. Following retirement, she returned to Oklahoma City to be with her family.

Norma was a kind, gentle and loving person who cared deeply for others. She was thoughtful and knew how to make others feel special. She adored music of all genres, gardening, her beloved Dallas Cowboys and OU Sooners, WWE Smackdown, the perfect red lipstick and all things glamorous. Norma enjoyed spending time with her loving companion Ron Williams. Like two halves of the same coin, Ron and Norma had a wonderful relationship steeped in friendship and love. Most of all Norma adored her family, especially her daughter and grandchildren. Chandler (her Angel), Christian (her Little Professor) and Chase (Baby Chase) were her pride and joy.
