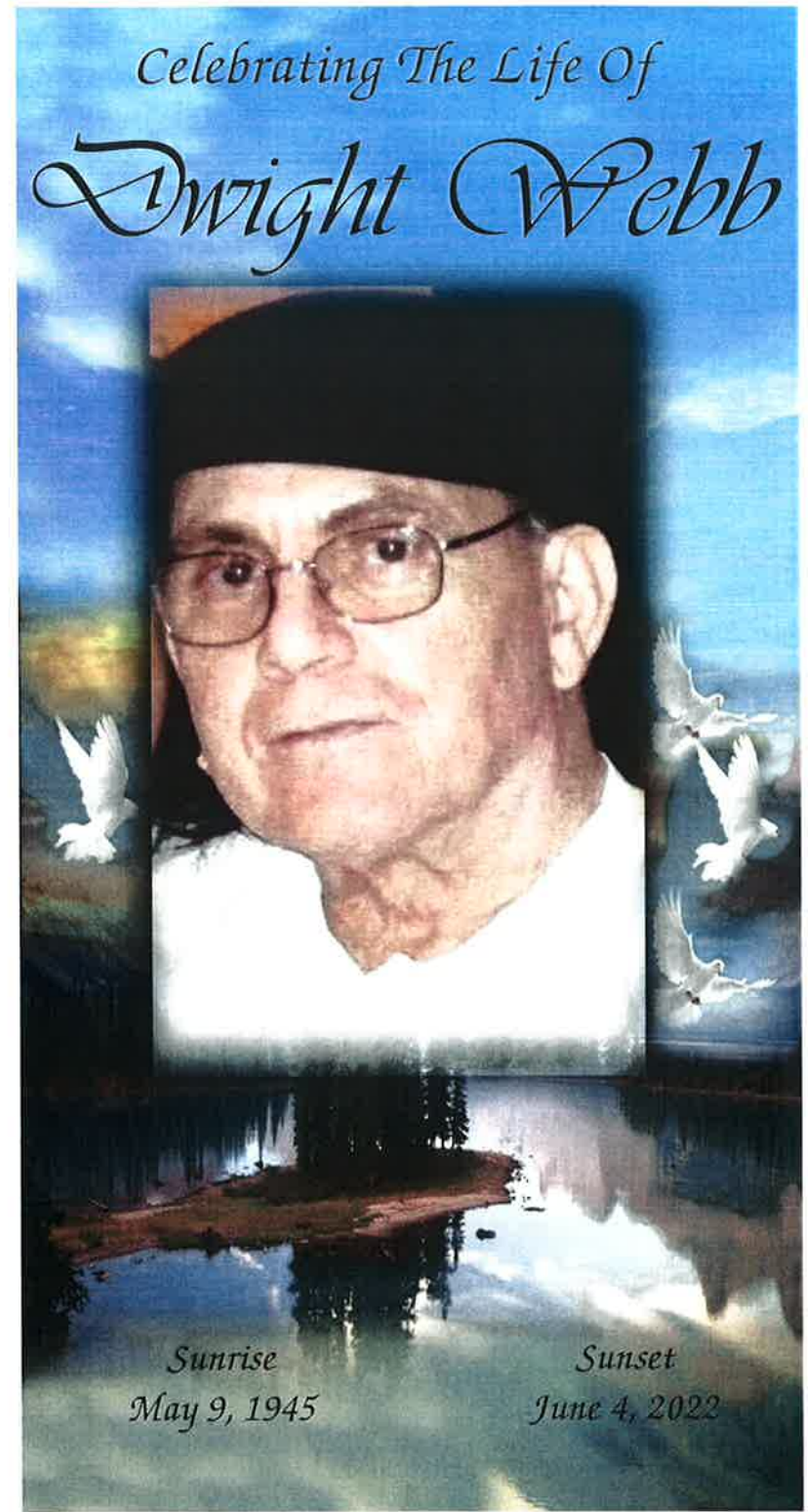

Three daughters were born from this union.

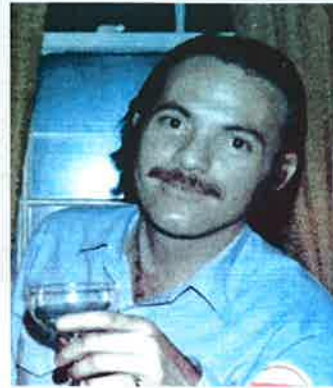
