Dorothy gave her life to the Lord and was a member of Shiloh Baptist Church until she moved to Oklahoma City after graduating from high school. Dorothy continued her education at Metro-Tech, received certificates for Home Health.

Dorothy came to Oklahoma City and stayed with her aunt, Helen Miles and met her first husband, Earl N. Tyson, who preceded her in death, and to this union were five children. In 1956, Dorothy met and married Otis Scott, Sr. a widower, with one son, and with this union were five children. The families were joined together as one, and was blessed. Otis passed after 47 years of marriage in February 2005.

Dorothy united with the Church of God (W.H.P.W.H.O.B.) in 1957 at 507 North Rhode Island, under the pastorate of the late Chief Bishop Wm. J. Fizer. She was a faithful Sunday School Teacher, Missionary, an excellent Secretary. She served faithfully in the Nursing Home Ministry, visiting the sick and shut-in and served in the Food Ministry, prepared in the dining hall. Dorothy opened her home to anyone needing a hot home-cooked meal, and a bed to lay in, and there was always enough room for all. She was a faithful and dutiful member until 2007. In 2009, she began to serve under Pastor Robert Freeman, Great Gethsamene Church, after his passing Pastor Reuben Tyson became pastor. Dorothy served faithfully until her health failed, she was dutiful in all she did for the church; whether it was hospitality, saying words of welcome or even a response to the welcome.

Dorothy was a housewife for many years, she worked in many capacities; Domestic worker for the Penningtons, head Chef for Shepherd Manor Retirement Home for many years. Dorothy became caregiver for Mr. Harold Ginden until she retired.

Dorothy's favorite past time was praying for her family, reading her devotion daily, watching TBN and Daystar; cooking and baking was something she loved and blessing others with her meals; Food Network was one of her shows she loved watching The Kitchen and Ree Drummond, and also HGTV, gave her ideas.

She was so honored to speak, and served to pour out in so many , whenever she traveled and the anointing of the Lord was upon her.

Even during her last day of sickness, on this side of heaven, she ministered to her children to prepare them for transitioning. She even prayed and gave words of wisdom to her caretakers, Dr.'s, nurses, until her last breath.
