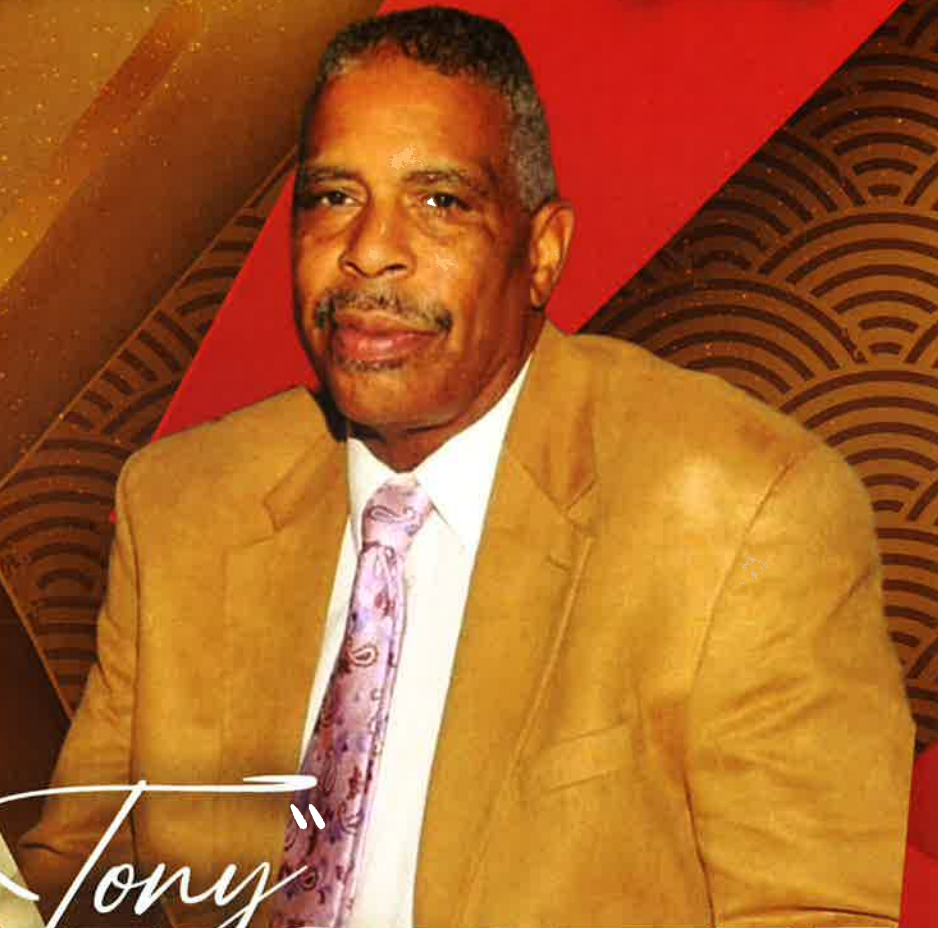

Life REFLECTIONS

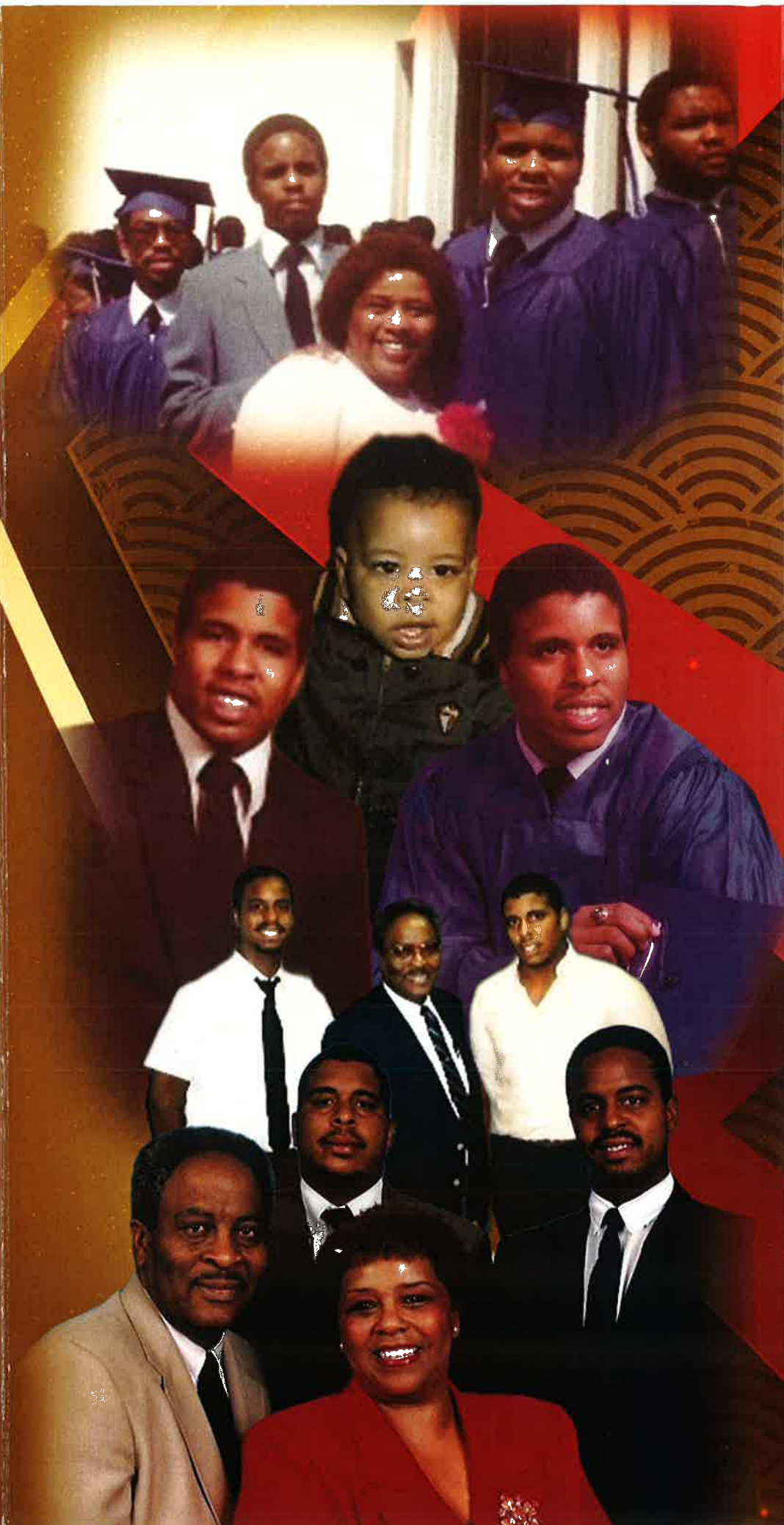
